## Tour Luke Miller House, bid on holiday wreaths

**MADISON** — Step back in time from 1 to 4 p.m., Sunday, Dec. 9, by taking a visit to the historic Luke Miller house, 105 Ridgedale Ave. in Madison. Tour the house and participate in a silent auction for uniquely decorated holiday wreaths.

Members of the Madison Garden Club, students at the Madison High School and members of the Madison Historical Society will all be part of the creative process as they fashion 50 one-of-a-kind wreaths for holiday decorations to be auctioned off at a silent auction which takes place at 4 p.m.

The Luke Miller house, built some time between 1730-50, was saved from destruction after the Borough of Madison purchased the large property, put the excess land into the already existing Summerfield Park behind it and then put the house back on the tax rolls by offering it for sale.

The house was purchased by an owner who appreciated the house's long history. He has since worked in cooperation
