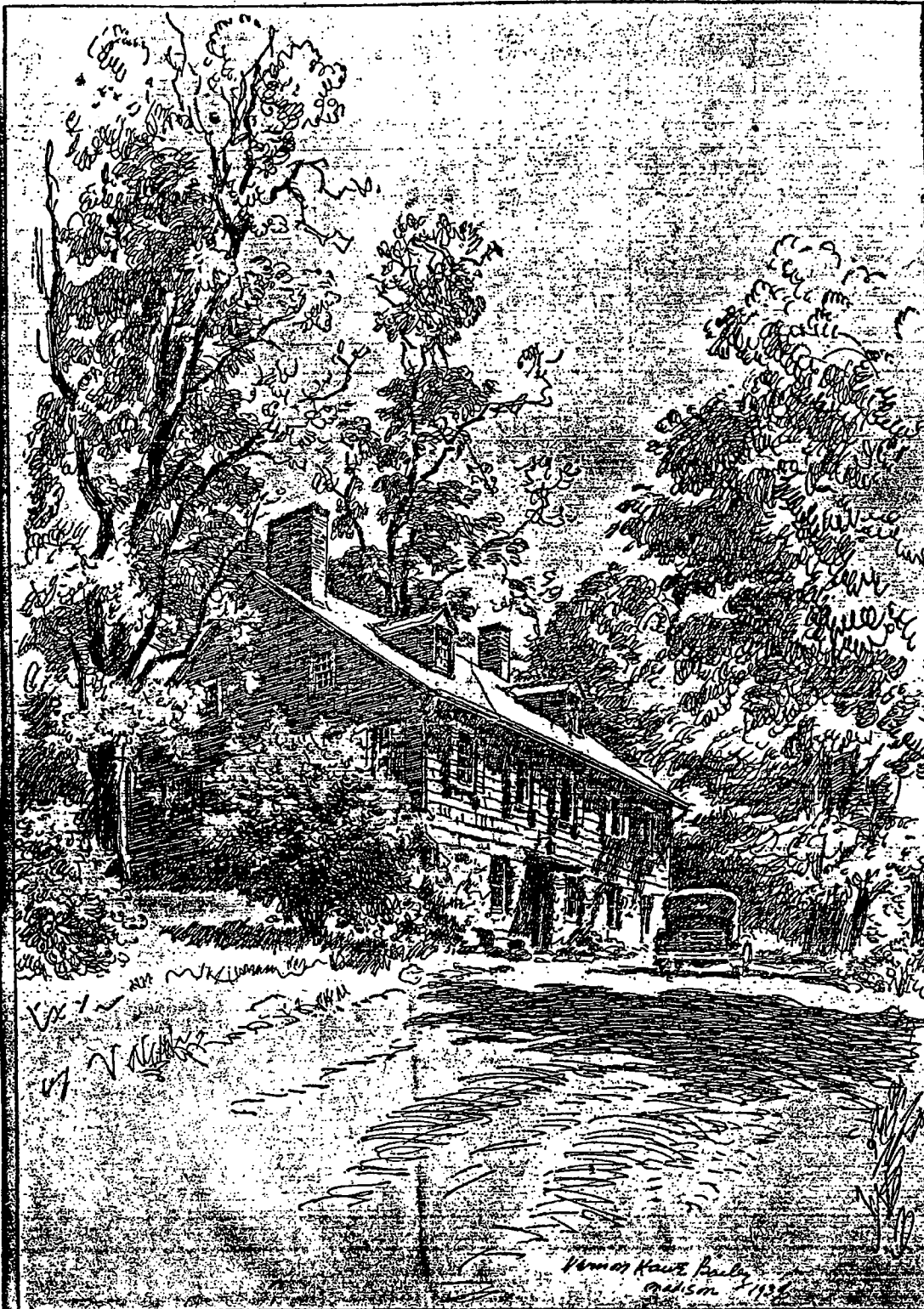


SKETCHES OF NEW YORK'S SUBURBS—No. 340

Madison, N. J.—Miller House.

Erected prior to 1750 by Andrew Miller, this building at 105 Ridgedale avenue, Madison, is but a short distance of the old Minisink Trail, which was used by Indians while they traveled between Minisink Island, in the Delaware River, and the Highlands of the Navesink. Beneath the sub-cellar of the old house is a tunnel lead-

ing to an old forge sixty feet north of the site. This tunnel was used by occupants of the house when Indians raided the premises. Major Luke Miller, a grandson of the builder, lived in the house for ninety-one years. The building now is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Matthew G. Jones. Tomorrow—Newark, N. J.—Federal Square.
